ART 1313 FOUNDATIONS IN ART – FALL 2019

Course Description: Curriculum development and planning for teaching art in the elementary and/or secondary schools, including basic design elements and principles, media, art appreciation and art criticism.

Art materials: The SPC art department will provide many of the materials necessary. The following materials must be purchased by the student:

Course Objectives:

- 1. To provide direction for developing a sound program of education in art, complying with the guidelines established by the State of Texas.
- 2. To incorporate the theories of art education and methodology with practical helpful assistance to teachers and students preparing to teach art to children and integrate art as a reinforcement for other subject areas.

3. To gain knowledge relative to discipline-based art education and its application to elementary art forms.

- 4. To understand the principles of assessing student artwork.
- 5. To understand health and safety in the classroom.
- 6. To use art adaptability in applications to a variety of subjects.

Course Structure: The course structure will include lecture, discussion, interaction, demonstration and hands-on work relative to the teaching of art in the public schools.

Classroom Decorum
